2019 Exemplar Award for Community Service Physician, Publisher, Philanthropist, Business and Civic Leader DR. SUDHIR M. PARIKH

Sudhir Parikh is among the most prominent and honored contemporary Americans of Indian descent. He has been recognized for his professional, civic and philanthropic initiatives by the governments of both India and the US. These have included the Ellis Island Medal of Honor Award, the highest civilian honor for uniquely accomplished U.S. immigrants, conferred in 2005, the Pravasi Bharatiya Samman, bestowed on notable non-resident Indians by the Government of India, conferred in 2006, and the Padma Shri Award, conferred in 2010 by the President of India. He was additionally knighted by the Knights of Malta in 2012.

Dr. Parikh has also been a member of the National Leadership Advisory Committee of the U.S. Congressional Caucus on India and Indian Americans, and was an invited member of the US delegations to India which accompanied both President Bill Clinton and President Barak Obama. He has served as a benefactor and leaders of organizations including the American India Foundation, the Federation of Indian Associations (FIA), Indian American Forum for Political Education (IAFPE), the Gujarat Cancer Society, and others.

Professionally, Dr. Parikh is a preeminent U.S. allergist and Founder & CEO of Centers for Asthma & Allergy, an amalgam, of 24 clinics across the greater New York-New Jersey metropolitan area. He is a Diplomate of American Board of Allergy and Immunology, a Clinical Associate Professor at the Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, a Fellow of the American College of Allergy & Immunology, a Fellow, Allergy/Immunology at the New York Medical College and Metropolitan Hospital Center, New York, and a Trustee of American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPI).

Dr. Parikh is additionally Chairman of the Board and CEO of Parikh Worldwide Media Inc., the largest Indian-American publishing group in the U.S. PWM newspapers include the national weeklies News India Times, Desi Talk in New York, Desi Talk in Chicago, and Gujarat Times. PWM additionally publishes The Indian American, a national bimonthly feature magazine, and it owns and operates ITV Gold, the longest running South Asian Television channel in the US.

2019 Exemplar Award for Business Leadership President, Sony Pictures Television Worldwide Networks, 2002-2018 ANDY KAPLAN

Andy Kaplan is among the handful of individuals most responsible for the massive growth of the multibillion-dollar Indian media and entertainment industries in the 21st century. For 16 years, through February 2018, he was President of Sony Pictures Television Worldwide Networks, a collection of 180 channels reaching almost two billion subscribers in more than 50 countries. He specifically guided and led the success of Sony Pictures Networks India, which includes Sony Entertainment Television (SET), long the nation's #1 entertainment channel, in addition to overseeing all aspects of operations for more than 20 other Sony channels there, several of which are also included among the country's most popular. He additionally commissioned the production of much original programming in India, as well as successfully securing distribution for Sony's leading India networks across South Andy and into 36 nations globally.

Within India Andy also directly forged the media alliances which created the joint-ventures between Sony and ESPN, for sports television, and between Sony and the BBC Earth channels. He additionally orchestrated Sony's \$385M acquisition of TEN Sports, India's most popular collection of sports networks. Still further, he structured and negotiated the successful \$1 billion television licensing deal between Sony and IPL --- the India Premiere League --- the country's preeminent cricket league.

Andy is presently a global media advisor, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the National Association of Television Program Executives (NATPE), Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Zimmer Children's Museum, Chair man of the Board of Governors for the USC Annenberg School's Center for the Digital Future, and Non-Executive Chairman of QYou India, a pioneering provider of streaming media in South Asia. He is additionally a member of the Board of Directors of the International Academy of Television, Arts & Sciences and the UCLA School of Theater, Film and Television.

2019 Exemplar Award for Academic Achievement President, The Policy Research and Management Network / India PROFESSOR SUDHA PAI

Professor Sudha Pai is a preeminent Indian political scientist, educator, author and columnist whose distinguished career spans almost four decades. She is currently President of the research think tank, Policy Research and Management Network (PRAMAN) in New Delhi. PRAMAN's mission is to help improve the quality of Indian public policy formulation, implementation and evaluation through creation and dissemination of knowledge, and it undertakes research on multiple aspects of Indian public policy in areas including health, education, agriculture and foreign policy. She retired in 2016 as Professor of Political Science at JNU's Centre for Political Studies and as Rector (Pro-Vice Chancellor). Dr. Pai holds a PhD from JNU and has over 35 years of teaching and research experience at JNU, Delhi University and Gargi College. She originally joined JNU, in 1980, as Assistant Professor within the Centre for Political Studies, School of Social Sciences. At the Centre she has taught courses and guided research in the fields of Indian politics and comparative politics. Her research interests include Dalit politics, state politics in India, agrarian politics, globalization and legislative governance. Her former students now hold faculty positions in many leading Indian universities, the Indian Civil Services, journalism and NGOs.

Dr. Pai has been key member of many significant research-driven initiatives in India including for the United Nations Research Institution for Social Development and the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency. She was additionally a second at the

Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi from 2006 to 2009 where she completed the bool Developmental State and the Dalit Question: Congress Response. She has been member of many academic boards, including currently the Advisory Committee of the Bharti Institute of Public Policy, Mohali, part of the Indian School of Business in Hyderabad. Widely travelled, she has organized and spoken at numerous Indian and international conferences and seminars. Well known for her research on various aspects of Indian politics, she has authored a number of books, the latest of which is Everyday Communalism: Riots in Contemporary Uttar Pradesh. She is also well known for her many articles in leading Indian newspapers, notably The Indian Express and The Economic Times and the authoritative website, TheWire.in.


